In January Rob met with our umbrella community organisation PCA - Pittwater Community Alliance - and indicated he would stay in the community and is interested in staying involved with local community groups.

APA will engage with all candidates to advocate for our area. The issues we want to know their views on:

- * Inappropriate & overdevelopment (residential, seniors, commercial)
- Urban tree canopy (loss)
- * Sustainable transport electric vehicles, cars, buses, charging stations cycling, electric bikes
- Walking, footpaths
- * Opposition to PEP11 or similar projects offshore
- * Need for involvement with community groups

CONSERVATION ZONES REVIEW PROPOSAL

APA continues to follow the discussion on this proposal. At a recent meeting organised by councillor Miranda Korzy, an environmental lawyer James Ryan pointed out there is no requirement for councils to harmonise LEPs (Local environment plans). We will ask for justification for this proposal, who will benefit from this and engage with councillors to let them know we are concerned about the detrimental impact of this proposal. This could result from changes to Residential from Conservation, with it giving council the green light to approve denser residential developments and also making the land subject to developments prohibited by NBC regulations but permitted under State Environmental Planning Policies, (SEPPS) such as Seniors Living, with loss of trees and other vegetation.

From an NBC email to the community on February 18:

We received and analysed 935 submissions on this proposal from 837 individuals. A copy of the submissions will be available on our <u>project website</u> by the end of February 2023, along with a Consultation Report which summarises key issues and Council's response.

We anticipate many of the issues raised can be resolved by changes to the draft Conservation Zones Review methodology currently being investigated by Council. Where areas of dispute remain about the accuracy of Council mapping of criteria used in the review, we will engage relevant consultants and contact those landowners to arrange a site inspection. We are expecting to undertake these inspections between April and June 2023. The outcomes from the Review will help us in discussions with the Department of Planning and Environment in the development of the draft Northern Beaches Local Environmental Plan and Development Control Plan, which will be presented to Council and exhibited for community feedback in 2024.

NORTHERN BEACHES CEO Resigns

Ray Brownlee has been NBC CEO since 2019 and he spoke at our AGM in 2019. We understand he is returning to Randwick Council. We wish him well and will engage with the new CEO when announced.

BARRENJOEY LIGHT HOUSE COTTAGES

Local residents let their voices be heard on January 22. We will continue to keep a watch on developments. APA believes that the current amenity allows the public access to the entire site and that to limit access to the public will be detrimental to the community and business. A community reference group will be formed to discuss the issue.



PEP 11

On Tuesday 6 February, the Commonwealth Government reached a Federal Court settlement to reinstate the PEP 11 offshore oil and gas exploration licence. The NSW government opposed the extension of PEP-11 in 2022 and reaffirmed its opposition on February 4. **APA will advocate with all candidates to oppose any such projects**.

LOCAL MATTERS

Old Wharf Reserve dinghies: Is yours here?

There are many dinghies stored in the access stairs to the beach next to Avalon Sailing club and on the rock platform adjacent to the stairs. Council indicated their process is to identify owners, advise owners to remove their dinghies and impound those whose owners cannot be identified. We will keep track of progress





Access to Woolworths from carpark – drainage. Council claims drainage issues have been addressed. We will monitor and take photos of flooding events.

Trial One Way Shared Zone in Avalon The building works resumed on 13 February. Shade shelters and seating have been installed and the place is taking shape. There is mixed feedback from the community on social media but we will take time to settle in with the changes. We remain concerned about the following issues and will continue to advocate with council:

10Kph zone at the crossroads Council has promised to install a VMS (electronic variable message sign) to remind residents. We are concerned this may only be a temporary arrangement.

Drainage Council are working on a storm water review. We will continue to monitor this.

Trial These changes are meant to be a trial. We have been told various factors including feedback from the community will be used to assess if it is a success. We will continue to ask what factors, how community feedback will be assessed.

NBC Customer Service Centre: Use it or Lose it!

Following action from the community, Council has agreed to leave the Avalon Service Centre hours as is but ONLY until March, when we understand patronage will be reassessed.

If patronage doesn't increase Council may reduce hours or close this centre altogether, as a cost saving measure.

We advise all residents to use the centre as often as possible. Council tracks every interaction at their service centres so that they have statistics to argue for closure when/if patronage drops off! Image: NBC



Watkins Rd Crown Land Reserve

An application by a property owner to acquire the crown land adjacent to the property was rejected. APA will advocate with council to install a sign that this strip of crown land which runs from Watkins Rd to Bangalley Headland is Public Land.
